Estimates for detailed occupations do not sum to the totals because the totals include occupations not shown separately. Estimates do not include self-employed workers.

Annual wages have been calculated by multiplying the corresponding hourly wage by 2,080 hours.

The relative standard error (RSE) is a measure of the reliability of a survey statistic. The smaller the relative standard error, the more precise the estimate.

The location quotient is the ratio of the area concentration of occupational employment to the national average concentration.
